Agenda Amendment

<u>Item 6A – Resolution – A resolution to Approve the Municipal Water Pollution</u> <u>Prevention Plan</u>

<u>Discussion of Mardi Gras 2025 and merging future parades together (K. Kellerman)</u>

Mr. Kellerman proposed that all future parades run "back to back". The first parade would begin at 10:00 a.m. and the second parade would immediately follow. He also asked that the organizers limit the number of parade entries.

Mr. Kellerman noted the reports of arrests and guns in the local newspaper and the need to shorten the time to eliminate violence.

Gerard Louis expressed his concerns for the merger of the parades on Mardi Gras Day.

Gary Roy expressed his concerns for keeping the parades separate.

"Big Brown" Joseph voiced his concerns for the crowd control. He stated that barricades were moved and placed in private yards or moved entirely.

Other comments included the presence of a marching group and the shortage of law enforcement officers.

Discussion of EV charger on Main Street (K. Kellerman)

Mr. Kellerman informed the council of his idea of placing an electric vehicle charging station in the city.

Mayor Smith intervened and reported council that he had already researched the matter and that a station would be installed by the next council meeting.

Motion by Mr. Kellerman and seconded by Ms. Nelson.

RESOLVED, That the city proceed with the installation of an electric vehicle charging station.

<u>Status report from engineers and Public Works Director – Line item report on each lift station (K. Kellerman)</u>

Steven Linderman of the engineering firm, Owen and White gave an update on the water/sewer projects. He also explained that the project delays are due to equipment delivery.

Discussion of Uber/Lyft in New Roads (K. Kellerman)

Mr. Kellerman voiced his concerns for Uber/Lyft services in the city.

Committee Reports

Mr. White reported that the hangar project at the airport is moving along and that the commission is considering the acquisition of additional property.

Council Reports

Mr. Hunter requested an update on Police Station No. 2. It was reported that a quote on the gate is pending and the steel doors have been ordered.

Mr. Kellerman mentioned a incident with the meter readers and whether or public works is following up on service order tickets.

Mrs. Grace Hebert appeared before the council to address issues with a waterline on her property next to Doris Park on New Roads Street.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Smith reported on the results of a test performed on utility bills and the delivery mail delivery thereof. It was deducted that it is not the utility bill processor.

With no further business to come before the council, the meeting adjourned at 6:55 p.m.
